INFORMATION FOR PRESCHOOL PARENTS

Welcome to Maryvale College Pre-school. Here are a few things we would like you to know about our school.

SCHOOL TIMES:

- You may drop your child off at 07h00. There is someone to look after him/her.
- For half-day pupils school begins at 07h30 and ends at 12h00.
- For full day (aftercare) pupils, school starts at 07h30 and ends at 17h00 or 18h00 (depending which slot is chosen).
- The children sleep / rest from 12h00 to 13h00 (1pm).
- Please do not be late in the mornings –not only is it a bad habit for your child to get into, but children who come to school late every day miss a lot of work.

PLEASE BRING:

- A school bag/satchel to keep food, uniform etc. in ;
- 2 x boxes of tissues / term
- 1 x wet wipes / term
- Liquid soap / term
- 1 x face cloth or hand towel
- A change of clothes and a school jersey and cap (available at the office) to be kept in the bag at all times.
- Old over-sized T-shirt for Art (Painting)
- Headphones with cord for Computers
- 1 x PVC Plastic A4 zip not stud carry folder (Meeco / Butterfly brands, to keep homework book safe)

For Rest time

- A small pillow.
- A small blanket (for winter) **(available at the office @ R150)**
- A small mat (yoga mat), if you would like for your child to sleep on.

UNIFORM:

- We have T-shirts in stock at R190 each – Yellow, Green, Red and Blue.
- The T-shirts are worn with black shorts, black takkies/trainers, and white socks. Velcro, not lace up takkies are preferred unless your child is learning or able to tie their own laces.
- Tracksuits for winter can be ordered from the office
- Swimming costume (black)
- Swimming cap (any colour)
- Swimming towels
- Flip flops

(ALL ITEMS MUST BE CLEARLY MARKED)

FOOD:

- Your child should bring his/her 9:45 mid-morning snack and water bottle in the school bag which is clearly marked with his/her name, daily.
- Treat day is on Friday. Children may bring, no more than R10 on a Friday if they would like to buy a treat from the tuckshop, or you can send a treat from home.
- Your child **MAY NOT** bring sweets, chocolates, or tins of fizzy drinks to school. Fruit, sandwiches (brown bread), yoghurt, fruit juice, liquid fruit etc. are the ideal lunches. If your child stays in the afternoon, please provide enough food for the day.



BIRTHDAYS:

We celebrate birthdays at school with a birthday ring. If your child's birthday falls during the holiday, then we will hold it before or after. **Please do not bring big sticky, creamy cakes** to school – it is easier to bring small cup-cakes or party packs to give out to the children. Please advise in advance if you DO NOT wish for your child to celebrate with a birthday ring.

IF YOUR CHILD IS SICK:

- If your child is sick or you are going away for a few days, please let us know.
- Health Department regulations require you to keep children with any infections at home until they are free of infection. So if you **suspect pink eye, measles, chicken pox, ring-worm etc.**, please keep your child at home as we don't want the teachers and children being infected too!
- Please send a doctor's note on the child's return.

FIRST WEEKS AT SCHOOL:

When your child goes to school for the first time, everything will seem very strange and new. He/she will probably cry for a while but don't let that stop you from taking him/her to school every day.

When Mum or Dad say goodbye very quickly and go away at once, the child usually accepts the situation very quickly. If your child is inclined to cling, just give him/her to the teacher and leave immediately.

After your child has settled he/she may go through a phase of "I don't want to go to school", children often do this but please be firm and make him/her come to school, as once they are in Primary school, they have to go every day.

COMMUNICATION WITH THE SCHOOL:

We are genuinely interested in all our "little ones" and in their development.

- Please write a note in the child's diary if you wish to discuss anything that may be happening at home or school, that may be affecting your child's behaviour or to arrange the Birthday Ring.
